**Louisville 38, Syracuse 35**

*Louisville holds off Syracuse's late push*

AJ Zarccone (22 points, 9 rebounds, 3 steals, 2 blocks) started out on fire for Louisville, scoring 8 points in the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter alone. However, Syracuse battled back, thanks to Quinn Haynes (15 points, 4 rebounds, 2 assists, 3 steals) leading the flow of the 'Cuse offense. Quinn had 4 points in the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter, while Blake Denhaese (6 points, 3 rebounds) and Nick Worineki added jumpers. At the end of the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter, the score was tied at 8.

The score was also tied at 19 at half-time, as each team matched each other step-for-step. Zarccone hit an early 3 in the quarter, and then added another lay-up to give his team a 13-8 lead. Ryan Tuite (10 points, 6 rebounds, 3 assists, 1 steal) quietly had his best game of the season, hitting a 3 pointer in the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter to stop the bleeding for Syracuse. Ethan Whitehead answered back with a basket for Louisville before Quinn Haynes and Jaedon Zalewski (2 points, 11 rebounds) combined for 8 points in the frame, to give Syracuse a 2 point lead. Right before the buzzer sounded however, Whitehead took a nice drive to the basket to tie the game at 19.

Louisville dominated play in the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter. Zarccone dropped 7 points, including a 3-pointer, and Nick Woods dominated in the paint, securing loose rebounds to add 4 points. Liam Mcnamara (6 points, 6 rebounds) also hit a jump shot. Louisville's success was based on their defense in the quarter, as Blake Denhaese was the only Syracuse player to find the score sheet, with 4 points. Louisville held a commanding 32-24 lead heading into the 4<sup>th</sup>.

Louisville started the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter right where they left off, as Whitehead hit another jumper. Although they were down 10, Syracuse would claw back. Quinn Hanes had a basket, and then Ryan Tuite hit a 3-pointer to cut the lead to 6 with 2 minutes remaining. After baskets by Zarccone and Mcnamara, the Louisville lead was back to 8. However, Quinn Haynes then scored on a drive to the basket, and cut the lead back to 6 points. Ryan Tuite would then hit another 3-pointer to cut the lead back to 3 points, with under a minute remaining. However, Louisville would hold on, moving the ball ahead of Syracuse pressure, to prevent them from fouling.

Syracuse did have a chance to tie at the end of regulation, however Ethan Whitehead had the game-winning block. Louisville held on to win, 38-35.
