

**Monday, March 2nd 2020**  
**Bulls 19, Bonnies 18**

*Bulls squeak past the Bonnies in a close game.*

In our first game of March, it was the Bulls taking on the Bonnies. The first quarter was a close, back-and-forth game as neither team really gave an inch on defense. Paige Raymond (6 points, 4 rebounds, 3 steals) got things going for the Bulls offense in the second quarter by attacking the basket and scoring an easy 2 points while also getting 2 rebounds in the quarter. Mirowski also scored 2 for the Bulls to give them 4 points in the quarter. The Bonnies were able answer back whenever the Bulls were able to score as Prezioso was able to score two points and so was Emeline Sparks (2 points, 5 rebounds, 1 assist). The Bulls took their slim lead into halftime with a score of 9-8 over the Bonnies.

The Bulls were able to take their slim one point lead from the first half and add to thanks in part to Paige Raymond's 4 points in the quarter as well as a layup by Gabby Giesing (4 points, 7 rebounds, 3 steals, 1 block) to give the Bulls 6 points in the quarter. The Bonnies continued to battle Pezioso led the charge, scoring 2 in the quarter while ripping down 5 rebounds and adding an assist on a Lexi Gampp basket. Ther Bulls slightly extended their lead to 15-12 heading into the fourth.

Emma Stahl led her team out on the court for the fourth quarter and went off, scoring all 6 of her points in the quarter while also grabbing 2 rebounds to help keep her team in the game as both teams continued to battle back-and-forth. 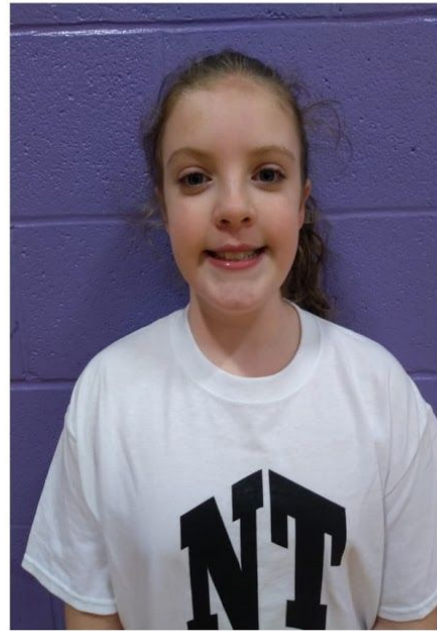
## Player of the Week
